

Pepperoni Pacino FAQs



Q: What prevents a pizza box from being recyclable?

A: If a pizza box is stained with grease or food particles, it is not recyclable and should be placed in the trash.

Q: If the top part of the pizza box has no grease or food particles, can it still be recycled?

A: Yes, you must remove the top portion and place in the blue bin. The bottom portion must go in the trash.

Q: What if grease and food particles are only on a small section of the box?

A: Tear or cut off the dirty part of the box and throw it in the trash. Be sure the remaining parts of the box are completely clean before placing them in the recycling bin.

Q: Why can't a pizza box stained with grease or food particles be recycled?

A: It can't be recycled because the paper fibers in the cardboard absorb the grease which interferes with the recycling process.

Q: If I scrape off the cheese and food particles from the pizza box, can it still be recycled?

A: No, a dirty pizza box should always be placed in the trash.
